Background

The National Dialogue on Sustainable Food Systems (SFS) in Albania, in the preparation for the UN Food Systems Summit 2021, was organized in June and July 2021 led by the Government of Albania (the National Convener: The Deputy Minister of Agriculture and Rural Development) and supported by the UN. During the UN Summit, Albania announced the National Pathways for SFS development and H.E. Frida Krifca Minister of Agriculture and Rural Development of the Republic of Albania stated the goals and priorities of the country to achieve sustainable development of food systems.

It is now time to further engage with the relevant sectoral policymakers (e.g. agriculture, tourism, health, education, trade, etc.), local communities and municipalities (e.g. farmer groups, local small/medium agricultural businesses, a local agency of extension advisory service, etc.). To facilitate further integration, strengthening and scaling-up of the combined SFS approach, FAO will provide support the national and local level dialogues to be carried out in the framework of the SFS-MED Platform - A multi-stakeholder initiative for Sustainable Food Systems in the Mediterranean¹.

Objective

The event is welcoming stakeholders to launch the country-level project implementation in the framework of the SFS-MED Platform - A multi-stakeholder initiative for SFS in the Mediterranean. During the event, National Pathway will be communicated, and participants will be encouraged to discuss the needs of elaboration and modification of the Pathway concerning country's priorities and needs which have emerged since the National Dialogues concluded last year.

The discussion sessions will be two parts - First, the challenges and common goals to achieve SFS in Albania from the perspective of experts/advisors from different Ministries, national and local institutions and second, from the perspective of the private sector, farmers and the rural community.

Dialogue will also address agritourism as one of the most important sectors that contributes highly to the economy of the country and has high potential to lever SFS development as well as the green economy of Albania.
